School Development Plan 2022-23: Main Priorities:

Targets:

- To continue to raise standards of LLC in line with the rationale of the new curriculum. Continue to focus on Curriculum Design and also 'Reading for Pleasure', 'Closing the Vocabulary Gap', Cymraeg Campus and Assessment.
- To continue to raise standards in STEM AOLE in line with the rationale of the new curriculum. Focus on Curriculum Design and also 'Numeracy across the curriculum', Science investigations, Lego Technology and Assessment.
- RVE -To continue to raise standards of RVE in line with the Diocesan Vision for Education and the rationale of the New National Curriculum . Develop as a School of Sanctuary.
- Work alongside the 'Orbit' Cluster group to ensure consistency in implementing the new CfW by sharing good practice and expertise. Develop a collaborative approach to assessment in the new curriculum.
- Continue to prioritise Mental Health & Wellbeing by implementing a Whole School approach:
- Complete the 'Autism Wales' Award
- Use Healthy Schools WSA self-evaluation and action planning tools to set whole school priorities.
- Work collaboratively with our 'Orbit' Cluster group to complete the 'Lenses' for Health & Well-being as part of our Curriculum Design.

Additional Learning Needs (ALN)

The school has been successfully preparing for the introduction of a new ALN Bill from January 2022. The aim is for there to be higher aspirations, a simpler system and increased participation of young people and their families which will lead to better outcomes. The ALN Bill will require a unified statutory plan/an IDP for those pupils who are currently at SA+. This is reviewed annually and replaces the current IEP. The new definition for ALN is below:

- (a) has a significantly greater difficulty in learning than the majority of others of the same age, or
- (b) has a disability which prevents or hinders him or her from making use of the educational facilities generally provided for others of the same age in mainstream maintained schools or mainstream institutions in the further education sector.

Pupils who are currently working at SA will now have support plans, not IEP's and will be put on a 'Cause for Concern' register so that their needs can be monitored closely. Mr Parry is the Additional Learning Needs Coordinator(ALNco) and he liaises between the LA, staff and families to ensure the very best outcomes for our pupils. Careful monitoring is undertaken and precise reports are kept. These procedures successfully allow all children to reach their full potential.

The Lead Governor for ALN is Mrs Jan Rees and the Deputy Governor for ALN is Mrs Gwyneth Thomas.

No Governor claimed any travel or subsistence allowance during the last year.

Policies

During the past year Governors have reviewed and ratified all of the Statutory Policies and Documents which are required to be considered on an annual basis. These include the Admissions Policy; Assessment Arrangements; Charging Policy; School Development Plan; Target Setting; Safeguarding Policy; Pay Policy; Behaviour and Relationships; Equal Opportunities Policy; Annual Report to Parents and Prospectus. A schedule has also been drawn up to ensure that all Statutory Policies and Documents are reviewed and ratified on a regular basis by Governors over a three year cycle.

Pupils with Disabilities

Pendoylan Church in Wales Primary School is built on one level with disabled toilets but no other specific facilities for disabled pupils. The school has a Disability Discrimination policy in place which gives clear guidance to ensure that we do not in any way discriminate against disabled pupils either preventing them accessing the school or the curriculum.

A positive image of disabled people is promoted via the attitudes of staff and pupils and through the teaching materials and other resources at the school's disposal.

Complaints

We pride ourselves on our home-school-church partnership and 'open door' policy. We therefore anticipate that complaints/concerns will be resolved amicably via parent/teacher informally and communication. Parents should bring any unresolved complaints/concerns to the head teacher in the first instance. Parents who remain dissatisfied should then contact the Chair of Governors who will deal with the complaint and, if necessary, raise the matter with the Governing Body. Welsh Language Development

Our children's Welsh Language development is progressively developed throughout the school in a range of enjoyable practical activities of oracy, reading and writing. Monitoring systems report, that standards of spoken Welsh and writing are 'good' and pupils are using incidental Welsh naturally. Last year the school focused on developing aspects of 'Cynefin' by capitalising on opportunities to explore the historical, cultural and artistic elements of our Welsh heritage. The school made good progress developing the 'Cymraeg Campus Goals' this year and will soon complete our journey towards the Bronze Award.

The Governing Body Finance Team meet throughout the academic year to ensure that the budget is spent using 'best value for money' principles. They work alongside the Headteacher and the LA Finance Officer so that there is a robust process of Financial accountability and transparency. Governors are very pleased to report that the school ended the year in a surplus and would like to thank the Finance Team and our LA Finance Officer for all their hard work. The surplus monies will go to increasing the capacity of ICT resources and beginning to upgrade classroom furniture in 2022-23.

Toilet Facilities

We are required to report that there are more than sufficient toilets provided for the number of pupils. All toilets are officially cleaned at the beginning and end of each day to ensure the highest of hygiene standards during the COVID-19 pandemic.

School Fund

This fund is used to provide many extra resources /subsidising school trips etc. to the benefit of Pendoylan children.' Own Clothes Day' and occasional sponsored events contribute to this fund. The fund is audited annually.

Security

Pendoylan School has a controlled access system. The main external doors are electro-magnetically locked throughout the day. An intercom system is used to enter the building supported by a digital monitor. The CCTV monitors all areas of the school
